Teacher Tip: Build reading, writing, listening, and speaking opportunities into every lesson. OSY students often benefit from being offered reading, writing, listening, and speaking challenges, and work at the equivalent of the last grade level they were in. They may have surpassed this level since then, but it's a good place to start.

Lesson Intro: Watch this! Begin the discussion

about meeting new people, family relationships, and language barriers (and build background knowledge) by watching a read-aloud of Drawn Together.

Lesson: Start with the Personal Information and Common English Phrases lessons in English in Minutes Book One.

Extensions: Expand the lesson and add depth with resources such as the following.

Many of our students say they want to practice their conversation skills. You can use these Top 5 Small talk ESL activities to help them do just that and to work on speaking more fluently at the same time.



Explore the Personal Information, Family Members, and Leisure Activities pages of the Interactive Picture Dictionary. Students can also use others, depending on their interests.

Striking up (=starting) conversations and keeping them going is important to good communication. Have students practice with Basic English "Introductions" from Randall's Listening Lab. Learning how to say hello (starting a conversation) and ending a conversation smoothly are very important to making friends. Students can practice with the Conversation Starters activities.

Have students practice their small talk skills with the Achievery lesson Pick Your Pitch (Gr 9-12). "Can you tell me about yourself?" People will ask this guestion throughout their life: at interviews, at family parties, in personal essays... But how should they answer it? In this lesson, students craft their answers and practice using it in a mock interview setting.



Help students unleash their inner child with activities from 23 ESL Speaking Activities for Adults: Free Their Inner Kids.

Use some activities and ideas from Small Talk Ideas: ESL Games and Activities such as Find Something in Common, Small Talk Tic-Tac-Toe, Role-Playing, and Speed Networking.

Have students practice introducing themselves and others with the Meeting People activity.

Keep it going! Build on this lesson with additional resources, such as:

Objective: Students will understand that cybersecurity is a practice that aims to protect networks, devices, and data from unauthorized access or criminal use and provides confidentiality, integrity, and availability of information. Students will learn how to create strong passwords for their accounts and devices and why they need to. Students will practice vocabulary.

Grade Span: 4th-OSY

Subjects: Digital Literacy

Teacher Tip: Focus on students practicing critical skills in reading, speaking, collaboration, and critical thinking throughout the lesson.

Lesson: We share a LOT of personal info online: pictures, videos, interests, relationships, etc. All of that is data. Use the Achievery Lesson Resource: <u>The Importance of Cybersecurity</u> How can we stay safe online? What is Cybersecurity? Meet Sophie and discover the importance of Cybersecurity. This learning unit was developed in collaboration with cybersecurity experts from AT&T.

Resource: Incorporate lessons and vocabulary from the Student Portal OSY resource <u>Practical Money Skills:</u> <u>Security Online.</u> Available in English and Spanish.

Activity: Lock it Down! Use the Achievery Lesson Resource: Creating a Good Password. In this activity, students learn how to make a good password for their online accounts.



Activity: And the Password is

Password (also known as Hot Seat) is a simple ESL game that takes no preclass preparation and is a great way for students to practice their vocabulary and speaking skills.

> The game of Password is a speaking activity that helps students review vocabulary and practice an important skill: describing something they don't know the word for. Students describe a vocabulary word with one

word clues, like the old game Password. It's the perfect way to help keep some old words fresh in your



students' minds and review English vocabulary.

Remember, we can do A LOT to help our students remember new words by reviewing them in class periodically. Password is an excellent way to do this. Password can also be used as a short warm-up game to review material from the previous class, or a quick filler at the end of class.

Materials required: White board and marker, a timer.

Number of students: 2+

Skills practiced: Listening, speaking, and vocabulary.

ESL Level: All levels

How to Play: Divide students into two groups. You need a minimum of two per team.

Place a chair in front of the whiteboard facing away from the board.

The groups will alternate sending a team member (captain) to the front of the class.

Write a word over their head, so the teammates can see and read it, but the captain cannot.

Write a word on the board, for example, "car."

The team must give the captain hints (not using the word in question) until they guess the word or time runs out (10-20 seconds). The team with the most points wins.



One team member sits in the chair and the other team members must explain the word on the board to the student in the chair (without saying the actual word.)

If the student says the correct word the team is awarded a point. Keep a score of the points and the team with the highest number of points is the winner.

The Sham-Burger

Tell students they get to be food stylists today and make their own "faux food" they'll actually want to eat!

Materials:

- Vanilla wafers
- Keebler Grasshopper cookies
- Red and yellow squirt icing
- Coconut Green food coloring
- Green gumdrops (optional)
- Sugar cookies
- Food container print-outs
- Orange juice concentrate

Are your students influenced by taste or by advertising? In this lesson, they get to test their taste buds and the power of branding on their brains. See if they choose something because of its name or because of its taste with a Mystery Brand Taste Test that will keep

for days. As a picture-perfect hamburger flashes across a television



One thing that tastes great on a hot summer day is an ice cream cone, but as soon as the cone is brought out into the sun, (ask the students what happens to ice cream when it gets hot in the sun, or in their hands) the ice cream starts to melt slowly into a sticky puddle. So how does ice cream last under the heat of

the spotlights? (Ask the students what they think that the commercial makers do to the ice cream to stop it from melting.) The truth is that, sometimes, the ice cream seen in advertisements is not really ice cream. If they're selling hot fudge or whipping cream, it's okay to fake it.

While colored mashed potatoes are commonly used to replace ice cream food (ask students why stylists would use mash potatoes, can they be easily shaped, ingredients added or easily colored?) stylists may also use a <u>mixture</u> of ingredients to form a clay-like substance that can be easily shaped and will not melt. Fake ice cream is a food stylist's best friend. It looks just like the real thing, but it never melts. (Make fake ice cream with the students, divide them into pairs or teams (depending on your amount of ingredients) have them read a recipe card you've either written up on the board or on 3x5 cards, find their ingredients, and mix them according to the directions.)

Recipe

- · Shortening or margarine
- Powdered sugar
- Corn syrup

Mix the ingredients together until evenly combined. This fake ice cream is smooth like clay, but it crumbles just like real ice cream when scooped. Best of all, you can keep it for months in a plastic bag and it will still look good. But how will it taste?
